ORDER GRANTING TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER

CAME TO BE HEARD Plaintiff Nicia Vitorino's Application for Temporary Restraining
Order.

After considering the pleadings, the evidence on file, and the arguments of counsel, the Court finds that the application for the temporary restraining order is well taken and should be GRANTED per the terms stated below. Moreover, there is a reasonable likelihood that Defendants in this cause will continue their courses of action absent this restraining order.

The Court further finds that an ex parte order without notice to Defendants was necessary, because to notify Defendants would impair or annul the Court's power to grant relief because the subject matter of the application could be removed, secreted, or destroyed, if notice were required.

a. from transferring (or taking steps to transfer) title to the Property, or otherwise
 causing a lien or other property right to attach to the Property.
