FINAL JUDGMENT

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

On June 13, 2024, Plaintiff, Misty Morin, moved for default judgment after Defendants failed to file an answer in this case. The court determined it had jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties in this proceeding. After considering the pleadings and papers on file in this case, as well as the evidence Plaintiff presented on damages, the court grants the motion.

It is accordingly ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Plaintiff recover the following from DAVID PETTUS, Defendant as follows:

- \$50,000.00 to Plaintiff Misty Morin, jointly and severally with Defendant David Pettus;
- \$7,471.74 to Plaintiff Misty Morin ("Attorney Fees"), and the following conditional awards of attorney's fees in the following circumstances:
 - a. \$5,000.00 each time Defendant files any post-trial motion or bill seeking to vacate or in any way alter this Judgment that does not result in a material modification to this Judgment;
 - b. \$15,000.00 in the event Defendant files an appeal to the Court of Appeals that does not result in reversal of this Judgment;
 - c. \$3,000.00 in the event Defendant files a motion for rehearing or reconsideration in the Court of Appeals that does not result in a reversal of this Judgment;
 - d. \$5,000.00 in the event Plaintiff responds to Defendant's petition for review to the Supreme Court of Texas (should same be filed), but does not result in reversal of this Judgment;
 - e. \$15,000.00 in the event the Supreme Court of Texas

- accepts Defendant's petition for review or appeal, but does not result in reversal of this Judgment;
- f. \$7,500.00 in the event the Supreme Court of Texas holds oral argument on Defendant's petition for reviewor appeal, but does not result in reversal of this Judgment; and
- g. \$2,500.00 in the event Defendant files a motion for rehearing or reconsideration in the Supreme Court of Texas that does not result in a reversal of this Judgment; and
- h. \$2,500.00 each time Plaintiff obtains aid from the court to obtain satisfaction on the judgment by way of a writ of execution, writ of garnishment, or writ of attachment for collection of this Judgment.
- \$869.69 in ("Court Costs"), jointly and severally with Defendant David Pettus;
- prejudgment interest on the amounts awarded to traintiff for damages in the past at five percent per year, from January 12, 202 Cuntil the date the Court signs this Final Judgment ("the Prejudgment Interest") and
- post-judgment interest on the amounts awarded to Plaintiff, the Pre-Judgment Interest, and the Court Costs, at five percent per year, compounded annually, from the date the Court signs this Final Judgment.

It is accordingly ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that Plaintiff recover the following from DAVID PETTUS ATTORNEY AT LAW, P.C., Defendant as follows:

- \$50,000.00 to Plaintiff Misty Morin, jointly and severally with Defendant David Pettus Attorney at Law P.C.;
- \$869.69 in ("Court Costs"), jointly and severally with Defendant David Pettus Attorney at Law, P.C.;
- prejudgment interest on the amounts awarded to Plaintiff for damages in the past at five percent per year, from January 12, 2024 until the date the Court signs this Final Judgment ("the Prejudgment Interest"); and
- post-judgment interest on the amounts awarded to Plaintiff, the Pre-Judgment Interest and the Court Costs, at five percent per year, compounded annually, from the date the Court signs this Final Judgment.

It is further ORDERED that:

- All writs and process for the enforcement and collection of this judgment may issue as necessary;
- The Sherriff or Constable (including deputies) charged with obeying the command of any writ of process issues to may do so using any and all force necessary and by any mean; and
- This Final Judgment finally disposes of all parties and all claims and is appealable.
